-One line should be empty beneath the title, and the body should be font size 10.5.

-Paragraph beginnings should be indented using the tab key (five-spaces worth).

-One line should be empty between paragraphs

-Please put two spaces between periods (.), exclamation marks (!), and question marks (?)

-Please do not include your organization or name

3. A voice recording of your speech

With your own voice, please record yourself presenting the speech. Speeches exceeding 8 minutes will not be considered. Please do not include your organization or name in the recording.
